Nancy Murphy Adams' great love was the study of groups as vital components of human life. In 1965 the Washington School of Psychiatry sponsored the first American conference using the Tavistock method for the study of groups in which Nancy participated. She said that from that time forward group relations became "the work closest to my heart, our best hope of clarifying a confused and confusing world." She directed conferences and mentored numerous students in the method. They have carried her expertise and her wisdom worldwide.

THE LEGACY OF EARLY DEVELOPMENT AS SEEN FROM THE MINNESOTA LONGITUDINAL STUDY OF RISK AND ADAPTATION

The lecture will be given by Alan Sroufe, PhD, who is internationally recognized as one of the foremost contributors to our understanding of how attachment relationships and developmental processes influence normal and pathological development through the life span. The lecture's focus is on the effects of early attachment relations on development and is rooted in the rich data collected by the Minnesota Longitudinal Study.

This lecture introduces an increased focus on attachment theory at the Washington School of Psychiatry. Look for the Adult Attachment Interview (AAI) training following this conference and a new training program next fall.

The Saturday conference will focus on how attachment and developmental research can influence the therapist's clinical responsiveness and facilitate growth.

The conference is intended for psychologists, psychiatrists, social workers, psychiatric nurses, licensed professional counselors, physicians, medical students, and other graduate students.

4. Discuss how research on the Adult Attachment Interview can influence clinical listening.
5. Explain how early attachment relations have a special role in development.

Alan Sroufe, PhD is a Professor Emeritus, Department of Psychology at the University of Minnesota and Director of the Minnesota Longitudinal Study of Risk and Adaptation at the Institute of Child Development of the University of Minnesota. He is one of the authors of *The Development of the Person* published by Guilford Press.

June Sroufe, PhD is a psychodynamic psychotherapist. She has been a certified trainer and scorer of the AAI since 1996. She has published a number of articles in the areas of relationship theory, family functioning, and clinical uses of the AAI. She is a board member of the Minnesota ICP&P.

Elizabeth Carr APRN, MSN, BC is a Director Emeritus, faculty member, and Supervising and Training Analyst of the ICP&P. She is also Associate Editor of *Psychoanalytic Inquiry*.

Mauricio Cortina, MD is the Director of the Attachment and Human Development Center at the Washington School of Psychiatry, and a faculty member of WSP and ICP&P.

Marie Hellinger, MSW is on the faculty of WSP and ICP&P. She is also a Supervising and Training Analyst at ICP&P.

Georgia DeGangi, PhD, OTR, FAOTA is a clinical psychologist and an occupational therapist in private practice at Integrated Therapy Services-Psychological and Learning Support Services in Kensington, MD. She is a faculty member of WSP.
