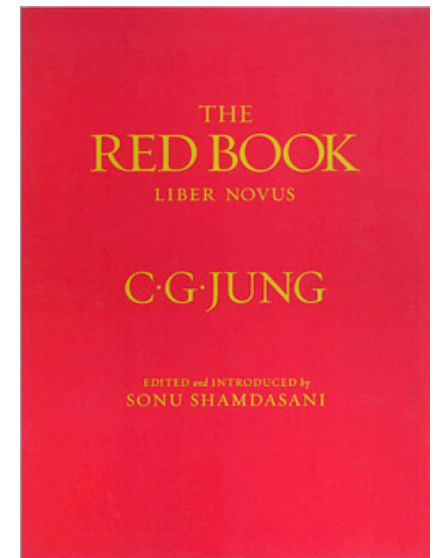

Carl Gustav Jung developed his “Red Book” or *Liber Novus*, both writing and art work, during the period from 1913 to 1929. He was developing many key concepts of his Analytic Psychology at this time. Hence, the Red Book, essentially Jung’s look into himself, reveals insights into a new dimension of the inner world and of the innermost dimension of the powerful psyche. All his future writings are in essence the elaboration, expansion, amplification and organization of his experience with the erupting manifestation of his inner world into his consciousness.

Dr. Scarcella will talk about Jung’s Red Book as an encounter of Jung with his soul. Fundamentally the book is Jung asking himself what he must do with his life. It could be said to be about his mid-life crisis.

Jung is questioning the strong possibility that how we have been thinking so far, might not be the correct or efficient or useful way to go about the understanding of human beings. He suggests the need to shift into another way of exploring the existence of what is behind the observable.

The book remained unpublished for years. At his death, the book continued to be in the possession of his family and was not published widely until fall 2009.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Participants will be able to:

1. Describe the archetypes and collective unconscious as they manifest in all individuals and particularly in the dysfunctional aspects of patients.
2. Apply the concept of the unconscious structures to reach deep reasons for patients’

- problems more quickly and easily.
3. Compare Freudian vs. Jungian psychotherapy for their respective strengths in treatment. Apply the understanding of the deep strata of the human unconscious as elucidated in Jung’s Red Book in the clinical setting.
4. Identify the importance of the historical aspect in which Freud and Jung lived.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

The workshop is intended for psychologists, psychiatrists, social workers, psychiatric nurses, licensed professional counselors, physicians, medical students, and other graduate students.

PRESENTER

Dr. Erminia Scarcella is a Psychiatrist and Psychoanalyst in private practice in Washington DC., She is also the Designated Physician of the Embassy of Italy. She is the President of Jung Society of Washington DC. She teaches at GWU and at Howard University.

She is the Chair of the IMG [International Medical Graduates] for WPS and founder of the Embassy Disaster Preparedness which is a humanitarian project designed to assist international victims of disaster in the metropolitan area.

She has been chapter and national president of the American Society of Psychoanalytic Physicians. She has been a Trustee of the American Academy of Psychoanalysis and Dynamic Psychiatry. She has worked full time at VAMC and WRAMC before entering private practice.
