ETHICS AND THE UNCONSCIOUS: LACANIAN PERSPECTIVES ON THE DIRECTION OF THE TREATMENT

The role of the therapist is inscribed in an ethical register. For the group therapist this means that ongoing attention must be paid to two kinds of mediation: the mediation of the other (little other) or ego and the mediation of the Other (big Other) or law of the father, the guarantor of the social link. Participants will have the opportunity to examine the central consequences for the human in moving from the world of nature to the universe of culture, and how the TRUTH OF THE SUBJECT is revealed by the unconscious.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Participants will be able to:

- Identify the foundational aspects informing the conduct of psychoanalytic treatment from an ethical point of view.
- Apply this knowledge in the conduct of treatment.
- Assess more clearly the issues of transference and countertransference that come up in any treatment situations.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

The conference is intended for psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, psychiatric nurses, licensed professional counselors.

We are also inviting faculty and graduate students in the departments of clinical psychology, the arts, philosophy, literature, and gender studies to this conference. Lacanian psychoanalysis welcomes all those interested in exploring the human condition from all these perspectives. This was quite true as well of Harry Stack Sullivan the founder of the WSP.
